ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

Holy Family School is pleased to offer students access to a computer for electrical mail and use of the Internet. This access will enable students to explore thousands of libraries, databases, museums and other repositories of information, and to exchange communication with other Internet users around the world. Families should be aware that some materials accessible via the Internet might contain items that are illegal, defamatory, inaccurate, or potentially offensive. While the purpose of the school is to use Internet resources for constructive educational goals under close supervision, students may find ways to access unacceptable material. We believe that the benefits to students in the form of information resources and opportunities for collaboration outweigh the disadvantages. Parents and guardians of minors, as well as the school, are responsible for setting and conveying the standards their children should follow when using the media. We support and respect each family's right to decide whether or not to apply for access.

To gain this access, all students must obtain parental permission as verified by the signatures on the attached form. Should a parent prefer a student not have e-mail and Internet access, use of the computers is still possible for other purposes such as word processing.

Students are responsible for good behavior on school computers just as they are in a classroom or a school hallway. As communications on the Internet are often public in nature, general school rules for behavior and communications apply. Access to the Internet is given to students to conduct research and communicate with others. It is given to students who agree to act in a considerate and responsible manner. Access is s privilege, not a right. It may be revoked if abused. Students are advised never to access, keep, or send anything that they would not want their parents or teachers to see.

RULES

<u>Privacy</u> - - Network and computer storage areas may be treated like school lockers. Teachers may review communications to maintain system integrity and to ensure that students are using the system responsibly. Students are not to trespass in another's folder, work or files.

Storage Capacity — Users are expected to delete e-mail that takes up excessive space.

Illegal Copying — Violating copyright law is not permitted.

<u>Inappropriate Materials or Language</u> - - No profane, abusive or impolite language or pictures should be used to communicate. Offensive material should not be accessed. Should a student encounter such material by accident, he/she should report it to the teacher immediately

<u>Safety</u> — Users should not reveal personal information, such as full name, address, or telephone number, about themselves or others.

<u>Good Advice</u>: To avoid the loss of computer privileges at <u>Holy Family</u> School:

- 1. Do not use a computer to harm other people or their work.
- 2. Do not damage the computer or network in any way. Any attempt to alter software configurations or computer settings is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to adding or deleting favorites, adding or deleting icons, and changing the appearance of the desktop, wallpaper, or screen-saver.
- 3. Do not waste limited resources such as disk space or printing capacity.
- 4. Do not use another's password.
- 5. BE PREPARED to be held accountable for your actions and for the loss of privileges if the Acceptable Use Policy is violated.
